


## **Manor Garden Club:**

## **Horner Park Advisory Council**

The Council reports that significant ADA-compliance improvements are underway in the big fieldhouse. Look for an elevator and rehabbed men's and women's basement locker rooms.

South of the little fieldhouse, look for the construction of the Officer Ceriale Memorial Flagpole. Police officer Michael A. Ceriale, who grew up in the neighborhood, played football in Horner Park, and graduated from Gordon Tech High School, was killed by gunfire while working undercover on a narcotics surveillance in 1998.

## **Recycling Refresher**

Are you a good recycler? Or a bad recycler? Use blue carts and drop-off centers, to recycle the following:

- glass bottles, milk, juice, waxy cardboard containers
- aluminum, tin, or steel cans
- plastic bottles and containers marked 1,2,3,4,5,7 Not 6
- newspapers, magazines, catalogs, cereal boxes
- junk mail, office paper and file folders, paper bags
- telephone books, paper books, paper towel rolls
- cardboard shipping boxes (flattened)

Take batteries to Chicago Public Libraries, Home Depot, and some grocery stores. Home Depot also collects fluorescent lights (tubes and CFLs).



## **Historical Marker**

The Ravenswood Manor Improvement Association will turn 100 in 2014, one of the oldest (if not the oldest) neighborhood groups in Chicago. As this anniversary approaches, watch this space for bits of our neighborhood history. This one comes from our application for designation as a historic neighborhood...

## **Spacious by Design**

Today's Ravenswood Manor neighborhood actually started out as a specifically planned housing development more than a century ago. In 1909, real estate developer W.E. Harmon purchased eight acres of rural land (previously inhabited by Miami Indians) from the Northeast Land Association. Ravenswood Manor was one of Harmon's new housing developments. Today's neighborhood maintains the same boundaries that Harmon himself first outlined. Harmon's concept was to develop a "suburb beautiful" on the land, which at that time was outside the booming Chicago's city limits. The Ravenswood Manor Improvement Association's Golden Jubilee Book (1964) describes:

"Harmon laid out streets and installed sidewalks, curbs, gutters, gas mains, sewers and main lines. In parkways, he planted elm and maple trees, many of which survive, and forsythia, bridal wreath, and other flowering bushes... it is likely Harmon intended to give a grand feeling to the subdivision by naming it for the main hall of an English estate."

The "planned neighborhood" offered specific types of houses available to purchasers that gave the neighborhood a cohesive look and feel. Under Harmon's plan, the houses in

the neighborhood are set back further from MANOR the street 1914 2014 than in adiacent areas to foster an open and spacious feeling as you enter the neighborhood. Many dwellers early bought multiple lots, thereby maintaining spaciousness and escaping the overrun destiny that plagued so many other urban neighborhoods. Over the decades, the RMIA has fought to retain single-family and limited multiple-dwelling zoning restrictions (such as in a 1957 comprehensive zooming ordinance), maintaining that spa-

ciousness so rare in Chicago.
