#### Community Gardeners and Leaders Needed in LaPointe Park

LaPointe Park is the open public space managed by the RMIA and neighborhood volunteers, at the north end of the Manor. Here are some of the ways to get involved this year...

- **Leaders** join the group that manages park maintenance, improvement -- and invitation.
- **Gardeners** if you just want to have some fun designing, pruning, and planting together.
- Community Garden Coordinator(s) are needed to manage the community garden plots
- **Vegetable Gardeners** who want to sign up to grow in one of our community garden plots.

Everyone is welcome to come out and enjoy gardening in the park – or bring water and lemonade for the people digging and pruning!

There are 18 community garden plots available, each roughly 4x6 feet. The cost is \$25 per plot. Assignments will be made in April, with priority given to returning gardeners who reply by April 20th. New gardeners will be allocated plots in the order their requests are received. If we run out of plots, we'll start waiting list.



#### **Spring Gardening Tips**

The outdoor gardening season is finally arriving in Chicago. Here are some things you can do now to prepare and update your garden:

- Cut back ornamental grasses in late March to early April, or when you see new growth at the base. Be careful not to cut any of the new growth in the process.
- Trees and shrubs that do not bloom in spring can be pruned now. Remove dead or crossed branches, and shape as needed. Spring bloomers (e.g., forsythia) should be pruned after blooming.
- Some plants with shallow crowns, like heuchera, can heave out of the ground over winter if we have frost and thaw cycles. Gently press the plants back in to the ground to protect the roots.
- Clear away fallen leaves or leaf mulch covering plants over the winter. Wet leaf debris can harbor pests and disease. Pull mulch back from perennial plant crowns as weather warms.
- Avoid walking in your garden when the soil is wet. This causes compaction, which makes it harder for roots to spread and nutrients to be taken up.
- When the forsythia blooms, uncover rose bushes if they have been mounded up with mulch or soil. Spring is the best time for pruning roses. Cut out broken or darkened canes and dead tips.
- April is a good time to plant, divide, or move perennials. Water all new or transplanted perennials well, and keep an eye on their watering needs to help them adjust to their new home.
- Last year's organic mulch can be worked in to the soil. Wood chips should not be worked in because they rob your soil of nitrogen. Compost added to the soil will improve fertility and drainage.

The May meeting, Monday, May 18th, also at Luther Memorial, will feature an overview of the Chicago Master Gardeners Program offered by the University of Illinois Extension.
