#### **Manor Park Tree Project Needs Support**

HPAC and RMIA are collaborating on a project to plant as many as eight new trees in and around Ravenswood Manor Park. Most of these would replace trees taken down in the last year, completing the parkways along Francisco and Manor, plus one tree inside the Park.

Following the Buffalo Park process used in 1992, the current plan relies on neighborhood donations to buy the trees and direct community involvement in the planting. We'll get a more interesting mix of trees than what the city would normally plant for us and be able to involve neighborhood kids in the planting.

Half of the estimated cost of \$2,000 has already been raised through a grant from Openlands. The next step is matching that with neighborhood donations. Watch for more news by email this summer and/or attend the next HPAC meeting on Monday, July 11th, in Manor Park at 7:30. Donations can be made to Horner Park Advisory Council, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, at *HornerPark.org*.

#### Merle's closes. Now what?

The writing had been on the wall and in the windows for several months, but Merle's Coffee Shoppe finally closed on April 30 (after once again catering our Winter Social and hosting our Annual Easter Egg Hunt). Owner Jeff Scoughton said, "Many thanks to our customers who supported Merle's to our closing day and many RMIA events for the last seven years."

When asked what's next for him, Jeff said, "We are trying to keep the catering business alive." In the short term, he's also seeking bookkeeping work, "with 29 years of experience doing my own bookkeeping, for all the businesses I've owned, I can adapt to any business using Quickbooks." 


