elcome to the second edition of the "Safety Zone" column. In this newsletter, we would like to share with readers some C.A.P. S. (Chicago Alternative Police Strategies) personal safety tips. These tips are issued by the Police Department, and while no one can guarantee your total safety, there are ways to lessen the chance of being victimized.

AT HOME: Don't be surprised. Keep doors locked of you are home alone and/or of you are working outside (i.e. lock the back door of you are home alone and working on the front lawn). Illuminate porches and backyard to discourage intruders.

We fully expected the resurfacing, textured crosswalks and speed humps on Manor Avenue to be finished by now. According to the 33rd Ward office, the State of Illinois has not yet released the allocated funds to the City. We believe scheduling this project for early summer 2002 will result in the best quality job for the neighborhood. During the winter, we will work with the various government agencies to finalize the plans and schedule.
