Manor Garden Club Plant Sale: Saturday, May 18


Are you wondering about what plants to buy for your containers this spring, which vegetables and herbs will grow on your deck in containers or maybe how to get some spring color in your yard? Well, come on over to the Manor Garden Club's annual Plant Sale for fresh, reasonably priced plants and expert advice from fellow gardeners who know your gardening conditions intimately because they live and garden in your neighborhood. The plant sale will be held on Saturday, May 18, at Luther Memorial Church, 2500 W. Wilson. The sale starts at 10 a.m., rain or shine.

"We have plants delivered on Saturday morning from a local nursery so they are fresh and

healthy. We pick plants that will perform well in our neighborhood," said Anne Rozmin, president of the club. "We've been doing this for many years and trial these plants ourselves, but we always have many brand new selections that we're excited about, too. There will be a great selection of tomatoes and other veggies, herbs, spring perennials and annuals for containers. Our hanging baskets are very full and lush, blooming all thru the summer. These are pesticide-free plants, too. There also will be donated perennials dug from members' own gardens. And, baked treats will also be for sale."

If you have a high school student in need of volunteer hours have them contact Manor Garden Club on their Facebook page. They will need to show up for the plant sale at 8 a.m. and work until 1 p.m. or so. No plant knowledge is necessary.

Manor Garden Club is in the process of rewriting their bylaws and changing their name to be more inclusive of the surrounding neighborhoods. "Over half our active members live outside the Manor and we're always being asked if there's a residency requirement. There is not and we welcome new members," said Rozmin. "We meet monthly at Luther Memorial Church and our meetings, including our program, are posted on our Facebook page. Anyone is welcome to attend. The next meeting is Monday, May 20th at 7:30 p.m."





Ravenswood Manor Garage Sale: Sunday, May 19

One of the neighborhood's biggest annual events is the Ravenswood Manor Garage Sale, coming up on Sunday, May 19! As you know if you've ever seen/attended it before, literally swarms of people come to the neighborhood (starting early, by around 8 a.m.) to comb the Manor for bargains and treasures in our residents' garages. It's especially helpful for families, as residents sell items that their kids have outgrown (clothes, baby items, even bikes!).

To add your garage to the sale, you need to do **two steps**:

1. Sign up to participate in the RMIA Neighborhood Garage Sale by registering on the website RMIA (http:// www.ravenswoodmanor.com/ garage-sale.html), and send a check to the RMIA (suggested donation: \$15; you can also submit this via PayPal on the website). Contributions help to defray expenses RMIA pays to advertise the Neighborhood Garage Sale in the Tribune, Sun Times, Reader, Daily Herald, Lerner Papers, and Craigslist.

Your registration here will get your garage listed on the Garage Sale Map, distributed by the RMIA.

2. You will also need to complete and submit the City's Garage Sale Permit Application Form (on the other side of this page). Please complete the form and either deliver it to Alderman Mell's office at 3649 North Kedzie Avenue, or fax it to Alderman Mell's office at 773-478-8006. Be sure to supply your contact information so that the alderman's office can send the permit to you. You may also call the Alderman's office 773-478-8040 for more information.

The RMIA is currently in need of volunteers to help organize the garage sale, even if only for a couple hours. Please contact garagesale@ravenswoodmanor.com to volunteer. Please remember that parking in the neighborhood is tough on the day of the sale. After the sale, the RMIA will arrange for an extra trash pickup to clear the alleys, as happened last year.

Another Successful Easter Egg Hunt!

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
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Narloch Piano Studio: A Ravenswood Manor Business

Christopher Narloch opened his piano studio at 4636 North Francisco on June 1, 2011, after a piano teacher, who taught in and has since left the Manor, asked if he could teach some neighborhood students. Christopher is classically trained and holds a Master of Music Degree in Music Performance with a specialization in Piano Pedagogy. Most students of the studio are between six and twelve years old, but there are some high school students and adults taught as well. He emphasizes that his teaching approach is all-inclusive and embraces some history as well as theory and technique. He gives students a CD so they can listen to a particular composer and discuss them at the following week's lesson. If you look in the window of the Narloch Pi-



ano Studio, you will see posters that students have created of their favorite composer on the wall. Students sign up for half-hour lessons once a week with a one-month commitment. Narloch Piano Studio performs four recitals per year with two in the studio, one in North Park Covenant Church, and one that will be part of the Summer Concert Series in Manor Park on Sunday, June 30, at 3 p.m. When asked if the red door to his studio has a story behind it, Christopher replied, "No, I just like the color!"
