RMIA Focus on Education



Election for Waters Elementary LSC Wednesday, May 1

Here is everything you ever wanted to know about LSCs, how to vote, why to vote and other ways you can get involved.

What is a Local School Council (LSC)?

An 11- or 12-member school council made up of elected groups of parents, teachers and community members who make critical decisions for each of the city's nearly 600 schools. Each LSC serves a two-year term.

What types of critical decisions do LSCs make?

They evaluate and sign a contract with the principal, approve the school improvement plan, oversee school budgets, plan and work with the administration and staff, and involve other parents and community members in the school.

Why is this important now?

Because elections for the 2002-2004 LSCs are this May. That includes the election for the LSC of Ravenswood Manor's public elementary school, Waters (located at Wilson and Rockwell).

Who elects the Waters Elementary School LSC?

You do! Each of us, as residents of Ravenswood Manor, has a right to elect Waters LSC members.

When is the Waters LSC election?

The election for Waters LSC is May 1, from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m., at Waters School.

I don't send my child to Waters. Why should I vote for the Waters LSC or get involved at all?

If you believe that the quality of your local school impacts the quality of life for you and your neighbors, then you should vote for the LSC members.

How can I learn more about the LSC candidates?

Attend the candidates' forum which will take place immediately following the April 8 Waters School LSC meeting. Or stop by the school and read the candidate statements. (Excerpts from two candidate statements, Ravenswood Manor resident Aaron Schwartz and Ravenswood Gardens resident Eva Moon, are included in this newsletter).

Meet Aaron Schwartz... Ravenswood Manor Resident Running for Waters LSC

My name is **Aaron Schwartz** and I was born and raised in the city of Chicago. I have lived in Ravenswood Manor for five vears. As a resident of the neighborhood and a parent of young children, I believe strongly that the prosperity and health of our community depend in large part on the quality and success of our schools. My interest in becoming a member of the Local School Council is based on my desire to work with a group of people dedicated to improving education so that all of our young people have the opportunity to reach high levels of achievement and knowledge.

If elected as a Community Representative to the Waters Elementary LSC, I plan to work closely with parents, teachers, students, the principal, and other council members to:

- 1) Take advantage of the rich diversity within our neighborhood by facilitating a connection between the school and the community
- 2) Promote the advancement of successful Waters' initiatives such as the conservation program and the fine arts program
- 3) Support a curriculum that places emphasis on teaching English while maintaining a commitment to multi-language education so that all children can reach their highest potential
- 4) Set policies designed to encourage and improve student

Do I need proof of identification to vote?

Yes. Be sure to take with you TWO forms of identification. At least one must list your address and be "official", such as a driver's license, State of Illinois ID or current utility bill.

Am I voting for community members, parents or both?

Each parent or community voter is entitled to cast one vote for up to a total of five (5) candidates, regardless of whether such candidates are parent or community representatives. Casting more than five votes spoils the parent/community ballot, while casting fewer than five does not.

What else can I do to get involved, besides voting?

Educate yourself. Attend a Waters LSC meeting. Join an LSC committee. Read up on Waters School on its Web site (http://collaboratory.nunet.net/waters/homepage.html). Attend the Waters School Open House on April 6, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. There are many ways to get involved. Your only limits are your own time.

Help the 33rd Ward Welcome Its New Magnet School!

nter-American Magnet School (IAMS), currently in the Lake-view neighborhood, has been designated a site at Cornelia Avenue and Whipple Street, just west of the former Montgo mery Ward store, and an award winning design. Although the Board of Education announced plans in 1997 to build a new facility for IAMS, funds have yet to be encumbered. Five free buses will take supporters to Springfield, Illinois on Tuesday, April 16, 2002 for a lobby day to press for the timely construction of the school.

RAFFITI ALERT! Warm weather tends to invite more graffiti. If you see anyone in the process of writing graffiti call 911. If you see graffiti results in the neighborhood, call 311 and ask for the 17th District to report it. If the graffiti is extensive, it will be important for the police to look at it so that they might be able to identify, through symbols & styles, who the offenders might be. The City will file a city service request to have the graffiti painted out. If the graffiti is less extensive, the request may be implemented over the phone at the time of the report. Either way, the graffiti will be removed within a few days.

Quick removal is the best defense for discouraging offenses.
