## Recycling Reminder

Blue cart recycling is in full swing in the Manor. As a reminder, here is a brief outline of what can and cannot be placed in the carts. There is no need to separate the recyclables when placing them into the bin. The types of materials that can be put in the bins are

Beverage cartons for milk and juice

Glass jars and bottles

Aluminum cans, foil and pie tins

Tin or steel cans

Cereal boxes, paper towel rolls

Flattened cardboard

Plastic bottles with numbers 1-5 and 7

Junk mail

Magazines and catalogs

Telephone books

Paper bags

Office paper and file folders

Newspapers and inserts

Items that cannot be placed in the carts are yard waste, non recyclable trash and household hazardous waste and electronics.

If residents need an additional blue cart or to have one of the existing black carts removed, please call 311.

## Community Garden Looking into Possible Expansion

The RMIA is exploring the possibility of expanding the Community Garden at LaPointe Park. Last year, the demand for plots exceeded the available space in the current garden, and there has already been enormous demand for plots this spring. This project is still in the planning stages, however, the RMIA seeking community input.

The plan under consideration is a second raised bed garden similar to the current garden but immediately to the south (away from the fence). The RMIA is seeking fundraising commitments to support the expanded Community Garden. For more information or to share your thoughts on the expansion plan, please contact

The daffodils have begun peaking out and it's not too soon to begin thinking about tomatoes for the Community Garden. The community garden has a limited amount of space for aspiring farmers, and last year demand for garden space exceeded the number of available plots.

LaPointe Park is managed by the RMIA in cooperation with NeighborSpace. Because of the applicable regulations, the garden must be in a raised bed of topsoil for growing vegetables. Therefore, in order to expand the garden, the RMIA must raise money for the cost of a second raised bed. The plots in the current garden may already be spoken for, but gardeners who contribute to the fundraising effort may be able to plant in an expanded garden. If you are able to contribute or interested in a plot, please contact us.

Gardeners can sign up and be assigned a plot to tend and cultivate. The entire garden will be turned over and tilled prior to the planting season so that the soil is ready for each gardener to start planting. Plots will be approximately four feet wide and six feet long, and gardeners can take an entire plot or share with a friend if they prefer. Plots will be ready for planting sometime in mid-May, weather permitting.
