


### **Historic District Fundraising**

The RMIA is initiating a fundraising campaign in support of its efforts to get Ravenswood Manor listed as a Historic District on the National Register of Historic Places. If the Manor is designated as a Historic District, certain homeowners who invest in cer-

tain remodeling may be eligible for a discount on their property taxes.

The National Register of Historic Places is the Nation's official list of cultural resources worthy of preservation. Properties listed in the Register include districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects that are significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, and culture. Listing in the National Register honors a historic place by recognizing its importance to its community, State or the Nation.



Owners of private property in a Historic District listed in the National Register are free to maintain, manage, or dispose of their property as they choose. Owners have no obligation to open their properties to the public, to restore them, or even to maintain them, if they choose not to do so. However, once the district is listed in the National Register, all owners of contributing single family homes may be eligible for a property tax freeze if they spend more than 25% of the property's assessed fair-market value, as determined by the Cook County Assessor, on rehabilitation of the property. Additionally, a listing on the National Register will help preserve the character of the Manor by inspiring interest in the unique historic architecture of

### **Keeping the Manor Safe**

Residents of the Manor who are concerned about crime and safety are encouraged to attend the local CAPS meetings. CAPS meetings provide an opportunity for neighbors to inform the Police Department about the concerns of the neighborhood. By working together with the Police Department, neighbors can help make the Manor as safe as possible.

The Manor falls under the jurisdiction of the 17<sup>th</sup> District of the

Chicago Police Department and there are two beats within the Manor. North of Wilson Avenue is Beat 1713 and south of Wilson Avenue is Beat 1724. The phone number for the 17<sup>th</sup> District station is (312) 742-4410.

If you see a crime in progress, please don't hesitate to call 911. The police cannot fight crimes they don't know about. If you have graffiti, please call that city at 311 and call Alderman Mell's office at (773) 418-8040.

Based on a submission prepared by RMIA volunteers, the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency (IHPA) has determined Ravenswood Manor is a good candidate for designation as an Historic District on the National Register. IHPA believes that the Manor is historically significant for its preservation of the original development plan for the neighborhood and for the variety of architectural styles represented in the Manor.

The support of IHPA is only the start of the application process for listing on the National Register. The next step is to be officially nominated. Nominations are submitted to a review board, which makes a recommendation as to whether the proposed historic district meets the National Register criteria.

RMIA is undertaking a fundraising campaign in order to support the cost of a paid professional who is best suited to prepare the nominating application. We have solicited proposals from multiple historical consultants and identified Granacki Historical Consultants as the best and most reasonably priced. Granacki has agreed to complete a nominating application for Ravenswood Manor for \$10,000.00.

RMIA has committed \$3,000.00 toward this project. We are soliciting donations from local resi-

dents to cover the remaining cost of \$7,000.00. We hope to have the funds raised by August 31, 2007. We hope that the nominating application will be submitted by the end of 2007 and that a determination will be made on our application in early 2008.

Funds pledged by residents in support of this initiative should be mailed to RMIA at P.O. Box 25486, Chicago, Illinois 60625. Checks should be made payable to the RMIA.

We look forward to your support for this effort and the realization of our goal to have the Manor listed on the National Register.




### **RMIA Book Club Update**
