Minutes: Bette asked that the July minutes include percentages reflecting the Block Meeting attendance. The minutes were approved with this change to the July minutes.

Parks: Mina discussed plans for LaPointe Park and has continued to connect with resources.

- \$6,500 is not enough to do what needs to be done
- Mina and the committee want to work with Ted Wolff. Ted will work with Christy Webber who
 gave an itemized proposal that includes grading.
- The garden beds will not be replaced at this time.
- Attention will be paid to the seed blend used.
- Ted's plan will be piecemeal, but will cost less. Brinda mentioned fundraising.
- Erik from Neighborspace said they find volunteers for projects like this.
- Mina asked the board for approval to pay Ted \$1,000 and to get started working with Neighborspace.
- The Board approved the request.

Zoning:

- The 15-member Zoning Committee had their first meeting in August. The next meeting will be on October 2 or 10.
- The developer for a single family home in the 2800 block of Eastwood is asking for zoning variances. The Zoning Committee is opposed to the request for variation in the back of the building and gave their comments to the alderman's office. The neighbors did not approve the variance request, so it went to the Zoning Board of Appeal which is why the alderman is involved. It was requested that the RMIA side with the neighbors.
- 2712 Montrose, where the Filipino grocery is located, is proposed to be torn down and replaced with a 6-unit building. The Zoning Committee will meet with the neighbors who live behind the property.
- There was notice given that 4530 North Richmond is going to be torn down.
- Members of the Zoning Committee will be posted on the RMIA website and in the e-newsletter so neighbors know who the members are.

Transportation:

• Bette contact contractors about concrete in front of Manor Cleaners.

- CTA has not commented on the repair of the mosaic at the Francisco stop.
- There is now news on the Greenway.

Social:
