Summer Concerts

This 25th annual series of concerts (and theater), which is organized by the Horner Park Advisory Council, kicks off on **Friday, June 7th, at 7 p.m.** The concerts, which are held every other Friday night, run through August and take place in three different parks: Ravenswood Manor, Sunken Gardens and Horner Park. Manor Bash

The Ravenswood Manor Improvement Association will celebrate its 105th anniversary with a series of free events in Manor Park. On **Friday, June 21st, at 7 p.m.**, Hōkūle'a Academy of Polynesian Arts will present Polynesian dancing, including the spectacular Fire Dance. Activities on **Saturday, June 22nd**, begin at 1 p.m. with a youth-focused circus workshop presented by Circ Esteem. Live reggae music (Akasha) will start at 3 p.m., followed by the Wayback Bank at 5 p.m., and ending with Ring Shout at 7 p.m.

Independence Bike Parade

This neighborhood tradition features children riding their decorated bicycles, trikes, and other vehicles (wagons etc.) along a three-block section of (temporarily) closed-off Manor Avenue, from Buffalo to Manor parks. The parade is often led by a Chicago Fire Department engine, with refreshments served at the conclusion. Tree Requests Due July 15th

The tree canopy in Ravenswood Manor is an important part of the neighborhood's character. In fact, the RMIA's logo features a tree sapling. Unfortunately, numerous parkway trees in the Manor have been lost recently due to storms, age, or insect damage.

If the parkway in front of your residence is missing a tree—and you are interested in helping to replace it—please contact the RMIA Parks and Parkways Committee at trees@ravenswoodmanor.com. The discounted cost of a tree to the property owner is \$100, with additional discounts available for senior citizens.

Trees will be planted this Fall, provided RMIA receives at least 20 requests for new trees.

Park, Trees, District

Three topics were on the agenda for RMIA's Semiannual Meeting, which was held on April 9th in the meeting room of the Horner Park Field House. An estimated 40 residents were in attendance.

- LaPointe Park Redesign. Mina Marien said the re-grading of the triangular park at Giddings and Manor is expected to be completed by June. The new landscaping plan for the park is expected to reduce flooding, while providing native plantings surrounding an open lawn area. After the plantings are completed, volunteers will be needed for regular watering. Marien also urged residents to contribute to the park's fundraising campaign at bit.ly/lapointepark.
- **Parkway Tree Plantings.** Deb Robinett, chair of RMIA's Parks and Parkway Committee, urged residents who would like to have a tree planted in the parkway in front of their residence to contact the committee at trees@ravenswood-manor.com. The cost of the tree is \$100; with an RMIA discount for senior citizens. Trees will be planted this coming Fall, in association with Openlands' TreeKeepers program.



• Landmark District Investigation. Gary Smith, chair of RMIA's Zoning Committee, provided an overview of the local landmark designation process to date. He noted that no official actions have been taken. In the meantime, the committee is investigating potential design guidelines. Doug Farr provided a brief history of the importance of

Ravenswood Manor as the first "Suburb Beautiful" to be developed following the 1909 Plan of Chicago.

LaPointe Park Needs Your Help

The triangular open space at the corner of Giddings and Manor avenues, known as Arthur LaPointe Park, is undergoing a makeover this spring. However, RMIA funds are only available to cover the first phase of the project, which includes re-grading, an open grass lawn, and native plantings.

Additional funds are needed for anchor plantings, including substantial bushes and ornamental shrubs at the north and south ends of the park. We also would like to install new benches in the park.

I Am Curious (Manor)



This 1911 photograph of Ravenswood Manor looks north from Montrose Avenue.

Q: A historic photograph recently was posted on RMIA's Instagram feed (ravenswoodmanorchi), showing what the neighborhood looked like in 1911. Can you provide any further information on this photograph?

A: RMIA's Research Committee discovered the fuzzy photograph on the web site of the Emil Bach House, 7415 N. Sheridan Road, a Chicago Landmark that was designed by Frank Lloyd Wright.

The historic photo, which looks north along Manor Avenue, shows Ravenswood Manor during its early development, following subdivision platting by Wm. E. Harmon & Co. in 1909, but prior to the construction of alleyways and the planting of trees.

Visible in the black-and-white photograph are three early bridges across the Chicago River (Lawrence Avenue, the Ravenswood 'L,' and Wilson Avenue). Also evident are several early residential buildings, including two in the 4400-block of California Avenue (south of Buffalo Park), several in the 2700- and 2800-blocks of Wilson Avenue, and one in the 2700-blocks of Sunnyside and Windsor avenues.

The photo appears to have been taken from a location south of Montrose Avenue (in what is now Horner Park), possibly from a hot-air balloon. The Bach & Sons Brick Co. operated on this site, just west of the Chicago River, from 1883 through the 1920s. After the brickyard closed, its clay pits were used as a landfill. Horner Park was constructed on the site in the 1950s.

The photographer is unknown, although it apparently was someone connected to the brickyard. William F. Bach, one of five brothers who co-owned the brickyard in 1911, lived with his family at 2810 W. Wilson Ave. In 1914, Bach's brother Emil hired Wright to design the residence on Sheridan Road. Somehow, the photo ended up in the house archives (www.emilbachhouse.com).
